


























Teamwork in Action: Sports Round-Up

The Attendance Shop


Our very successful attendance shop will be restocked ready for the next opening at the end of this half term. This initiative has been hugely successful and the children really understand that points mean prizes!

Parents are urged to avoid taking children out of school for holidays during term time.


